The first award was presented to CVS Pharmacy and the coalition discussed possible changes to the presentation but the feeling was that it went well and everyone was pleased with the way it was presented. CVS has a special needs person greeting customers as they come into the pharmacy and that is being received very well.

NEW BUSINESS

1. President Kay suggested that the next Gold Star Award be presented to Shelby County Player for their consideration of their attention to ensuring that people with special needs were able to enjoy performances along with everyone else. The coalition discussed changing the timing of the award to quarterly rather than monthly and everyone seemed to agree that it would be better than a monthly award.
2. Sidewalks – The group discussed the possibility of finding a way to help citizens fix or repair sidewalk problems. More discussion on how the group might find a way to provide some financial assistance by raising money in the future.
